



Rotary Club of Royal Hua Hin Projects July 2021 to August 2022.





Rotary International operates to 7 core areas of focus to support global and local communities. The Rotary Club of Royal Hua Hin supports the following areas of Focus through its sponsors indicated by the arrows.











July 2021 donation to registered charity Jungle Aid to support the purchase of a replacement vehicle to enable them to continue support for the five Koren speaking communities they support. RCRHH Donated 230,000 Thai Baht, this was supported by our global partnership with Rotary Club Noble Park Dingley in Australia who donated a further 40,000 Thai Baht.







The purchase 130 raincoats for the Lahu children at the Ban Meung Noi School, Chiang Rai. The raincoats were delivered in time for the rainy season in the area on 24 July, and help protect the children from illness. The cost of the project was 10,000 Thai Baht.













To support home schooling at Mercy House Foundation a children's home for 25 children the Rotary Club of Royal Hua Hin purchased two lap top computers to help the students to learn online using computers instead of mobile phones during the school closures due to Covid-19. Cost 31, 000 Thai Baht.







To complete phase 4 of the Rotary Education Center (REC) project which was delayed due to the availability of chips for the computes, the RCRHH saw delivery of the remaining 12 computers to complete the 34 required for the REC. The cost of the computers was 521,625 Thai Baht, the total cost of the project so far is 4,087, 637 Thai Baht.







Following a request for help from the Red Cross Clinic in Hua Hin the RCRHH purchased three items of equipment those being a Longray model 2680 mist sprayer which can spray chemicals, disinfectants and deodorants to maintain a clean working environment. A Battery operated Aspira Go 30 portable suction machine (aspirator), and a new internet system. Cost of project 32,500 Thai Baht.







Following a request from Hua Hin Hospital the RCRHH and the RC Hua Hin collaborated together to purchase essential items of Personal Protective equipment (PPE). These items were 100 sets (Dupont Tyvek 500) disposable suits and 250 N-95 Medical Face Mask to help protect hospital staff working with Covid-19 patients. Cost of project 20,000 Thai Baht.







The RCRHH were pleased to support one of our local schools Nong Hoi and purchase 50 sets of football shirts for their three football teams. Cost of project 10,000 Thai Baht. In addition we purchased further sporting equipment and donated trophies for a football tournament at a cost of a further 15,000 Thai Bhat.








To help Cha Am hospital the RCRHH sponsored a Covid-19 vaccination day purchasing 2000 bottles of drinking water to help keep people visiting the hospital hydrated.

Cost of Project 6,000 Thai Baht.











To commemorate world Polio day the RCRHH undertook a project to help people in quarantine at the green Hua Hin 3 quarantine facility. Staff working at the facility stated that the patients required drinks, snacks and other goodies to help them through the two weeks quarantine.

RCRHH put together 130 goodie bags at a cost of 23,320 Thai Bhat.








In a project started in 2019 with the Lizzy Education fund, and in line with Rotary Internationals empowering Girl's initiative, two young students were sponsored to complete a three year Business Management degree at a cost of 850,000 Thai Baht. The RCRHH donated 120,000 Thai Bhat towards the students final semesters.







To support our Sister club Rotary Club of Samui-Phangan, the RCRHH donated 20,000 Thai Bhat to help support their food for life project to feed migrant workers who were trapped on Kao Samui following loss of their jobs due to Covid 19.








To support our Sister club Rotary Club of Cheltenham in Australia who had been sponsoring a young Dr. Doris Livingston, the RCRHH donated 10,000 Thai Baht to help with her intern fees.

She started work at a hospital on Lake Victoria in Tanzania which had high cases of malaria and high mother and baby mortality rates through disease.








As part of the new core area of focus the RCRHH donated 20,000 Thai Baht to the Sang Foundation and supported two of the Growing Greener Communities events in Soi 94 purchasing soft toys and other goods to underprivileged children at a cost of 10,000 Thai Baht.







Following a request for help from the Thai Ayutthaya **Business Administration** Technological College (TAB) in Ayutthaya the RCRHH donated 20,000 Thai Baht to help two students attend a vocational training exchange trip to Porvoo in Finland. The trip helped improve their English language and gave them an insight of life in another country.











Supporting a joint project between Rotary Club of Bangkok South and The Thai Child Development Agency (TCDF) the RCRHH donated 30,000 Thai Baht towards a total cost of 159,000 Thai Bhat to support a school for children with learning difficulties near Ranong to rebuild a new garden community project and provide tools and equipment for the children to use on the community farm.






Rotary Year 117 Presidents project was to support the Beluga School for Life Phang Nga Province which is a children's home established in 2004 following the tsunami. The RCRHH donated 5000 Thai Baht towards dried goods and hygiene items. 63 of the 101 Presidents from Rotary District 3330 attended the event where all clubs donated various essential items and 101,000 Thai Baht to the school.













The RCRHH are pleased to join the online media company E-Jan who are building a new specialist school for children with learning difficulties near Hua Hin at a cost of 20 million Thai Baht. Our club recently donated 500, 000 Thai Baht and a further donation from RC Bangkok South of 100,000 Thai Baht to build a special audio sensory room at a cost of 1 million Thai Baht. We are confident to raise the full 1 million by next year.





Launch of the free English online program at the Rotary Education Center, Nongkhon School in partnership with the Rotary Club of Thavaravadi. The project will train 32 teachers in English in a 1 year program. The teachers have already started the online program to teach the students. The RCRHH invested 15,000 Thai Baht to support this project.











Since July 1st 2021 the Rotary Club of Royal Hua Hin have donated nearly 1.5 million Thai Baht to our projects you have seen in this presentation.

With your continued support we can continue our good work in the local communities, Thailand and globally.
